A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH HORTON EMERGENCY VEHICLES, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF A 2017 HORTON MODEL 623 RESCUE SQUAD, PURSUANT TO THE OHIO COOPERATIVE PURCHASING ACT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THREE THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED FORTY EIGHT DOLLARS AND NINETEEN CENTS (\$253,448.19), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Highland Heights, Ohio has, on February 23, 1988, adopted Resolution No. 13-1988 authorizing the City to participate in State contracts with the Department of Administrative Services, Office of State Purchasing, pursuant to the Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Act; and

WHEREAS, any purchase by the municipality made pursuant to the aforementioned Act is exempt from the competitive bidding requirements otherwise applicable to purchases in excess of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00); and

WHEREAS, the municipality has elected to purchase a 2017 Horton Model 623 Rescue Squad through the aforementioned Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to bids received pursuant to advertisement and in accordance with law, the State of Ohio, Department of Administrative Services, has declared Horton Emergency Vehicles, Inc. to be the lowest and best bidder for the aforementioned equipment; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND HEIGHTS, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Horton Emergency Vehicles, Inc. for the purchase of a 2017 Horton Model 623 Rescue Squad pursuant to the Ohio Cooperative Purchasing Act for the total amount not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Three Thousand, Four Hundred Forty Eight Dollars And Nineteen Cents (\$253,448.19).

Section 2. The amount of the contract authorized herein shall not, provided that said contract is in accordance with the specifications upon which the bid was received by the Department of Administrative Services.

Section 3. That the Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Highland Heights for the reason that the purchase authorized herein is necessary to maintain effective paramedic services to the City. It shall therefore, take effect immediately upon passage by the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
